millions

What Does It Mean?

What Does It Mean?

Think About It:

simple

What Does It Mean?

If something is simple, it is easy and does not have many parts.

Sentence:

Dolphins make jumping out of the ocean look **simple** and easy.



Think About It:

What is something simple that you do every day?

weaker

What Does It Mean?

When you are weaker, you have less strength than before.

Sentence:

One of these crab claws is **weaker** than the other. It is not very strong.



Think About It:

Are you weaker when you are sick or when you are healthy? Why do you think so?

wrapped

What Does It Mean?

To be wrapped around something is to cover or twist around it.

Sentence:

The octopus **wrapped** its strong tentacles around its prey.



Think About It:

Have you ever seen a vine wrapped around a tree? Where was it?

disgusting

What Does It Mean?

If something is disgusting, it makes you feel sick.

Sentence:

Yuck! The litter around the trash can smells **disgusting**!

Think About It:

Do you think worms are disgusting?



decide

What Does It Mean?

When you decide something, you choose what to do or to think.

Sentence:

Is this a starfish or a crab? You **decide**.



Think About It:

How do you decide what games to play with your friends?
